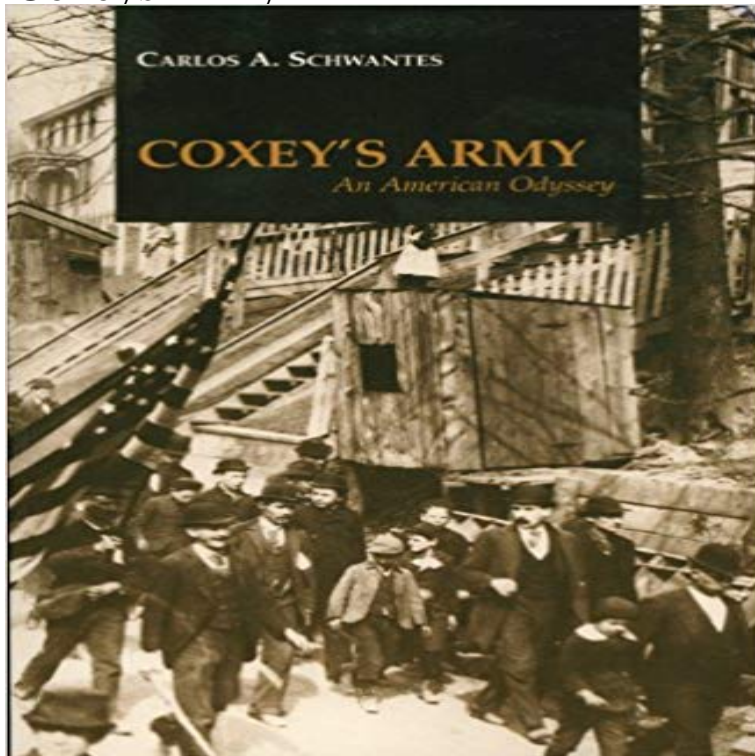


Coxeys Army
