

The Paradox of Chinas Post-Mao Reforms (Harvard Contemporary China Series)



Chinas bold program of reforms launched in the late 1970s--the move to a market economy and the opening to the outside world--ended the political chaos and economic stagnation of the Cultural Revolution and sparked Chinas unprecedented economic boom. Yet, while the reforms made possible a rising standard of living for the majority of Chinas population, they came at the cost of a weakening central government, increasing inequalities, and fragmenting society. They explore the changing patterns of the relationship between state and society that may have more profound significance for China than all the revolutionary movements that have convulsed it through most of the twentieth century.
